





GREAT THINGS ARE HAPPENING AT CA



Carbondale Area students are very enthusiastic, inquisitive, and excited to be exploring and learning computer science. They are learning to write code and having a mouse to help them maneuver as they are completing their programs is very beneficial. Mrs. Bailey created a project in *Donors Choose* to get a computer mouse for every student to use while in her classroom. With generous donations, her students are now able to use a mouse while coding. This enables them to debug and iterate in the precise location in their programs where needed, avoids frustration, and provides them the tool to be potentially much faster and proficient when manipulating their codes. They are now writing their own codes such as chatbots and

password generators. The students are excited and proud of their outcomes. They can use their Chromebooks more efficiently which frees them to be more creative in coding their programs.



Intro to Computer Science students recently created chatbots using the programming *Language Python*. This is a computer program designed to emulate human conversation. For this program, they used if statements, user input, and random numbers to create a basic chatbot. The chatbots asked the user to input answers to a question and then depending on the type of input, some of the chatbot responses were based on what the user typed, and some were based on random numbers.



AP CSP students recently created Polygon Generators from a previous program they coded in *Scratch* which is a block programming language. They created a procedure with at least one parameter, evaluated a previous program that they had created to improve upon its efficiency, and used multiple levels of abstraction to write the programs. Their programs could draw a regular polygon matching the given input for the parameter of sides. Students used ask blocks to get user input for the number of sides to be drawn in the polygons for specific shapes. Their next project will be creating password generators.



Roast Chicken dinner with Gravy

Prep: 10 mins

Cook: 1 hour 30 mins

Total: 1 hour 40 mins

Servings: 4

Yield: 4 servings

Ingredients:

¾ pound small red potatoes, halved
 2 large carrots, sliced diagonally into 1/2-inch-long rounds
 2 sprigs fresh thyme
 2 sprigs fresh rosemary
 salt and pepper to taste
 2 cups College Inn® Unsalted Bold Chicken Stock, divided, plus more as needed
 1 (4.5 pound) whole chicken
 1 tablespoon olive oil
 2 tablespoons all-purpose flour

1 tablespoon heavy cream (Optional)

Instructions Checklist

Step 1: Arrange a rack in the lower third of oven with no racks above it; preheat oven to 425 degrees F. Place potatoes, carrots, thyme, and rosemary in a 12-inch cast iron or other oven-safe deep skillet. Season with salt and pepper and pour in 1 cup of stock. Rub the skin of chicken with olive oil, then season with salt and pepper. Place chicken breast-side-up on top of vegetables.

Step 2: Roast chicken, basting with the pan juices every 20 minutes, about 60 to 75 minutes or until internal temperature reaches 165 degrees F. Transfer chicken to a platter, draining juices from the cavity of the chicken into the pan. Using a slotted spoon, remove vegetables and arrange

around chicken on the serving platter.

Step 3: Bring pan dripping to a simmer over medium heat. Add flour and whisk constantly for 1 minute. Add 1 cup of stock and whisk until smooth. Simmer until thickened, about 2 minutes. If too thick, whisk in additional stock 2 Tbsp. at a time until desired consistency is reached. Add cream, if desired, and season with salt and pepper to taste. Carve the chicken and serve with the vegetables and gravy.

Ingredients:

3 large eggs
 ½ cup half-and-half cream
 ¼ cup canned pumpkin puree
 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
 ¼ teaspoon pumpkin pie spice
 ¼ cup finely chopped walnuts
 8 slices of day-old bread



Step 1: Heat a lightly oiled skillet over medium heat.

Step 2: Whisk eggs, half and half, pumpkin, cinnamon, vanilla extract, pumpkin pie spice, and walnuts together in a bowl. Soak one slice of bread at a time in the pumpkin mixture, then place in the prepared skillet. Repeat with the remaining slices of bread. Stir the pumpkin mixture between dips to keep the walnuts from settling. Cook the bread until golden brown, about 3 minutes on each side.

 4 egg yolks
 3 cups of milk
 2 tablespoons butter (softened)
 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
 2 cups Hershey's dark special dark chocolate chips (divided)
 Whipped cream (for topping)

Directions

Bake the pie shell according to package directions. Remove from the oven and cool.

In a 2-quart saucepan stir together sugar, cornstarch, and salt. In a medium bowl combine egg yolks and milk. Gradually blend the milk mixture into the sugar mixture in the pan.

Cook over medium heat, stirring constantly until the mixture to a boil. Boil and stir for 1 minute. Remove from the heat and stir in butter and vanilla extract. Add 1 and 3/4 cups of chocolate chips and stir until

the chips are melted and the mixture is well blended. Pour into the prepared pie shell. Cover with plastic wrap and press the plastic wrap onto the filling. Cool. Refrigerate for several hours or until chilled and firm.

Top slices with whipped cream and remaining chocolate chips if desired
